I hope you will join us to sew at the Lutheran Church School on Tuesdays 9-whenever and/or Thursdays 11:30 to whenever. I have left a box of kits at the Sew-Lab. You can choose a pattern from the box, along with squares (clipped together) and additional white fabric as required by your pattern (there are several choices of patterns). Or, if you are in the mood to play with selvages, I have left my extensive collection of selvages there with two books about selvage projects. Feel free to help yourself.

Bonnie Sloan has graciously invited guild members to join her in free sewing at the former Lutheran school across from the public library in Yuba City. We will call the group Sew-Lab as not to confuse it with Sew Days at Fremont Administration.

We had a trial run recently and 5 guild members participated. Two worked on their own projects and the others worked on kits from Community Service. The best part about Sew-Lab is that there are sewing machines (8 or 10), cutting tables, equipment, ironing stations. You don't need to bring anything. Just come and sew. You can also leave your project there for your next visit. It's relaxing and a great way to get to know other quilters.

Bonnie has agreed to host Sew-Lab on Tuesdays, starting at 10 a.m. and Thursdays starting at 11:30 a.m. Let us know if these days work for you or if other times are more convenient.

Valley Quilt Guild Sew Day

There will be an open sew day at the Rideout Conference Center, 989 Plumas Street in Yuba City, from 9 am to 3:30 pm on Saturday, April 27. This is an opportunity to work on a community service project or on your own project with other guild members. It's a good place just to meet and work with other guild members, or even get feedback or help from other guild members. You can come for some or all of the time. The sew day is free, but you need to bring your own machine and supplies for your project. Colleen will provide a couple ironing boards and irons, a cutting station, and extension cords. You can bring your own as well. Lunch is on your own; you can bring it or get take out.

So I know how many to set up for, please either let me (Colleen) know you are planning to come by email or text, or signup at the April meeting. (If you decide last minute, it's okay to come anyway – we can always pull up another chair.)



Yuba-Sutter Fair

The Yuba-Sutter Fair is coming on June 20-23!

Valley Quilt Guild helps to set up and take down the quilts, and monitor the still exhibits in Franklin Hall during the fair in exchange for a substantial discount on the rental of the main exhibit hall for our quilt guild. There will be sign up sheets at the April and May meetings to help with set up, take down, and table shifts during the fair. The table shifts are mostly being at the table, talking to people, selling raffle tickets, and helping people to remember the no drinks or food rules – we have a place for them to set them down while they look. Please help out by signing up to help! We will have the raffle quilts at the April meeting if you want to purchase tickets, or just see what last year's blocks turned into.

Guild members are encouraged to enter a quilt or two or more in the fair. You can also enter the quilt block contest. Quilts are judged by a professional judge. Blocks are judged by a volunteer(s) ... more of a judges choice decision. You can enter online, or pickup an entry form at the fair office (or Sandy may be able to bring some to the April meeting.)

Entry deadline is Midnight on May 24, Entry delivery is June 7 and 8, and pickup after the fair is June 24. More information is available online at ysfair.com



Board Meeting Minutes

VQG BOARD MEETING Monday, April 8, 2024 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

Attendees: Sandy Parker, President; Deanna Williams, 1st Vice President; Colleen Pelfrey, Co-2st Vice President; Bonnie Sloan, Secretary; Marcella (Marci) Westhouse, Treasurer; Diane Leighton, Community Service; Sharon Easter, NCQC & QGNQ Representative; Nicki Lura, Membership; Linda Matsumoto, Sunshine; Cathy Klaker, Quilts of Valor.

I. Call to Order: A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was scheduled for April 8, 2024, at the Crossroads Community Church. The meeting was called to order at 4:10pm.

II. Announcements and additions to the agenda:

None.

III. Secretary: A motion to approve the minutes of the March 2024 meeting as written was made by Linda Matsumoto and seconded by Colleen Pelfrey. <u>A unanimous vote to approve the minutes as written</u>, followed.

Correspondence: Thank you notes to the guild were received from cancer quilt recipient, Glenda Kortz; Baby Lock raffle winner, Renee Hunter; and the Pine Tree Quilt Guild for our 2024 quilt show.

IV. Treasurer: Marci submitted a Budget-to-Actual (to date) report which is hereby incorporated in to these minutes by attachment, and noted the following bank account balances: general checking \$1,865.32; savings \$10,765.42; quilt show \$13,805.96; and fair equity \$1,742.49.

Dee inquired as to the miscellaneous income increase from \$951 to \$1,351. Diane stated the \$400 increase was due to sales of quilts at the community service booth during the quilt show.

Discussion regarding the \$200 "donation item in the Budget-to-Actual report for drapes and poles. The donation was specified for poles and drapes expenses. Noting that the money was specified for poles and drapes, Colleen asked for the budget for "Property Expenses" be increased to \$200 from \$0 in order to cover additional supplies purchased for the poles and drapes system. A motion was made by Diane Leighton to increase the properties budget to \$200, accept the corrected Treasurer's Report, and seconded by Nicki Lura. A unanimous vote to approve the motion followed.

Diane Leighton requested a budget addition of \$625 as that fund has been depleted. A motion was made by Colleen Pelfrey to add \$625 to the community service budget and was seconded by Dee Williams. The motion was carried with a vote of 8 "ayes" and 1 "abstain" (B. Sloan, conflict of interest), which followed.

New Business:

2025 Quilt Show – Colleen is working on plans for the opportunity quilt for the 2025 quilt show. Permission from Lorie Holt is pending for the opportunity quilt.

A motion was made by Colleen Pelfrey to raise the 2025 quilt show entrance fee to \$10, and was seconded by Nicki Lura. A unanimous vote to approve raising the 2025 quilt show entrance fee to \$10, followed.

Cathy Klaker advised that the guild consider continuing with the Avenue of Valor as in the past two quilt shows. Cathy will follow-up with the official Quilts of Valor organization as to whether or not it would be okay to have the quilts be part of the official "quilts of Valor" and report back to the Board at their May meeting. A motion was made by Colleen Pelfrey to continue with our Avenue of Valor for veterans and was seconded by Linda Matsumoto. A unanimous vote to approve continuing the Avenue of Valor, followed.

Community Service Budget Adjustment – See Treasurer, above.

Poles and Drapes Budget Adjustment – See Treasurer, above.

Nominations for next year's officers – We will need to recruit the following positions for next year's Board: President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, and Secretary.

Yuba Sutter Fair – The fair is June 20-23 and sign-ups for shifts will begin soon. They would like our quilts at the Fair by June 7^{th} or 8^{th} .

Committee Reports:

Vice Presidents: Colleen noted there will be a Sew Day on April 27, 9am.

Community Service: No report.

Membership: Nikki reported 144 current members, 3 new members and 1 new affiliate this month.

Quilt Show: No report.

Opportunity Quilt: No report.

Other: A motion was made by Sandy Parker to award Colleen Pelfrey a Lifetime Membership to the Valley Quilt Guild due to her many years of service to the guild, and seconded by Dee Williams. The motion was carried with a vote to award Colleen Pelfrey with a Lifetime Membership to Valley Quilt Guild with a vote of 8 "ayes" and 1 "abstain" (C. Pelfrey, conflict of interest), which followed.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 5:37 pm.
