In the next couple weeks, Sandra Torres helps me write descriptions, and the auction is put together. We advertise on social media ... I will post and hope people share. The auction is live from the Sunday before Thanksgiving to 7 pm on the Sunday after Thanksgiving.

Just so you know. Many items do not sell for what they are worth. I usually price them a little low, and see what bids we get. We've also had some very nice items that get no bids at all. I return these to the person who donated them. Items that are gently used are identified as such, and items that have some inconsistencies in workmanship are accurately detailed in the description. (For instance, I just put together a quilt and turned one of the pieces of fabric wrong side up. If I were to put it in the auction, I would make a note of that.) If you are able to accept this, I would love to have your donations. Any profit we make is helpful.

## **Board Meeting Minutes**

### **VQG BOARD MEETING**

Monday, August 14, 2023 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

Attendees: Sandy Parker, President; Deanna Williams, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President; Colleen Pelfrey and Jan Thompson, Co-2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President; Bonnie Sloan, Secretary; Marcella Westhouse, Treasurer; Sharon Easter, NCQC & QGNQ Representative; Diane Leighton, Community Service; Nicki Lura, Membership; Linda Matsumoto, Sunshine; Eileen Milligan, BOM.

**I. Call to Order:** A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on August 14, 2023, at the Crossroads Community Church. The meeting was called to order at 4:05pm.

### II. Announcements and additions to the agenda:

Add: Budget information to members, by Linda Matsumoto.

**III. Secretary:** A motion to approve the minutes of the July 2023 meeting as written was made by Linda Matsumoto and seconded by Deanna Williams. <u>A unanimous vote to approve the minutes as written followed.</u>

Correspondence: Thank You note from the Sutter Buttes Quilt Guild for our donation of sheets (drapes).

Colleen advised that there were no "takers" for the former wooden quilt racks that the guild had up for sale. Sandy advised that the Master Gardener was happy with the wood our guild donated, and will ask the schools if they can use the remaining wood for shop classes. Colleen noted the guild was able to eliminate one of the storage units.

**IV. Treasurer:** Marcella noted the Guild Checking account balance is \$6,523.99, Quilt Show account balance is \$5,816.04, and the Fair Equity account balance is \$1,717.49, and the Guild Savings account balance is \$9,969.51.

Colleen will follow up on the amount owing on the storage unit. Sandy will take the insurance bills to Pat May so she can check that they include the correct coverage and charges. The post office box fee increased to \$176 per year.

### **Old Business:**

- **Transfer to new officers (Bank Signatures) -** Sandy noted that she has cash from the last meeting to deposit, and arrangements will be made for the new board members to change out signatures on the bank accounts.
- Fair Report Colleen advised that Cooky (Amarel) said Dave Dilbo (Yuba-Sutter Fair) liked the guilds display and wind socks and would like to use them again next year, and that the Main Exhibit Hall is being updated including better acoustics, also, Dave will look into extending the wire we use for hanging quilts in Franklin Hall the full length of the building.
- Storage Due to the donation of wood poles from the previous quilt show racks, the guild has eliminated one storage unit. Colleen has made bags to hold the new pole system.

**Ice Cream Social** – Discussion regarding preparation for the social to be held at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in August. The Golden Valley Quilt Guild will have their

opportunity quilt present. Diane Leighton advised that there will not be a Community Service table at the ice cream social meeting/event.

**Christmas Party** – Will be held on the first Thursday of December at the Moose Lodge, Yuba City. The price has not increased since last year. The menu will consist of chicken or ham, mash potatoes and salad.

Auction – Colleen is proceeding with arrangements and encouraged donation of auction items, noting that holiday wall hangings have done particularly well in the past.

Appoint persons to make an internal audit - Sandy will look for qualified persons to perform an internal audit. Discussion regarding potential persons to perform audit.

Newsletter – Inclusion of itemized budget information in the newsletter. Discussed under "Other"

**Other** - Linda reported that members have requested more detailed income/expense/budget information. She asked if we could include that information with the newsletter. Discussion concerning how and when budget information should be shared with the membership, and regarding what reports the current accounting software can produce. The matter will be further explored.
