### Rally Up Fundraising Auction

Since COVID hit in 2020, Valley Quilt Guild has had a Rally Up fundraising auction. We are doing it again this year, and there are a variety of ways you can help.

- 1) Donate an item to be auctioned off. Colleen will collect auction items at the September and October meetings. Everything from a quilt or wall hanging or table topper you have and would like to donate, to a pattern or fabric you have that you realize you are not going to use, to other crafted items (we've had pin cushions, cutting boards, quilt racks, hand turned rippers, knitted items). We are looking for new or like-new items, although sometimes we have made exceptions. You can ask Colleen if you are unsure. Be aware the beginning bids are low ... they do not always reflect the value of your donation. Many things sell for less than their actual value, and it is really hard to predict what is going to be in high demand and what isn't. Anything that is not bid on at all, is returned to the donor after the auction. Also be aware that any inconsistencies in workmanship or condition will be noted in the description. If any of these things make you uncomfortable with donating, it's okay not to donate.
- 2) Bid on items in the Auction. The actual online auction will take place from the Saturday before Thanksgiving to the Sunday after Thanksgiving.
- 3) Use word of mouth or social media to let friends and family know that we are having an auction. Colleen will post it on her facebook page and the guild facebook page, and if you have a facebook page or other social media to help get the word out, that helps! Thank you all for always being so supportive!




#### Quilt Guilds of the North Quarter

The topic of discussion was all about the California Heritage Quilt Project, which was started in 1984 and is still going strong. Their project mission is to seek out and record the history of California quilts and their makers/owners; to foster conservation/preservation of the California quilt heritage; to increase public awareness and appreciation of quilts; and to encourage the art of quilt making.


