
# Notes from Sandy

# **Board Meeting Minutes**

### VQG BOARD MEETING

Monday, July 10, 2023 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

**I. Call to Order:** A Meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on July 10, 2023, at the Crossroads Community Church. It was called to order at 4:03 pm.

#### II. Announcements and additions to the agenda:

Add: Fair Wrap-up: Approval of Payment for Fair Sign

- **III. Secretary:** A motion to approve the minutes of the June meeting as written was made by Eileen Milligan and seconded by Jan Thompson. A unanimous vote to approve the minutes as written followed.
- **IV. Treasurer:** We have a Checking balance of \$7,991.98 and a Savings balance of \$9,969.51 for a total of \$17,961.49. Quilt Show balance is \$5,815.50 and the Fair Account balance is \$1,792.197.

#### V. Old Business

- **A. New officers** The new officers were welcomed.
- **B. Fair Wrap-Up** Fair quilt show winners can pick up their checks at the fair office. The Guild sold \$931 in raffle tickets. The four new ladders, purchased with fair money, worked out very well in hanging the quilts.

A motion to approve payment to Diane Leighton \$49.63 for printing a sign for use at the fair quilt display was made by Colleen Pelfrey and seconded Eileen Milligan. A unanimous vote to approve the payment followed.

- **C. Poles and Drapes** All the poles and drapes have been received. Colleen has made canvas bags for all the pieces with labels on each bag as to what goes in it. This will make set up and take down much easier.
- **D.** New home for wooden racks Colleen has posted photos, descriptions and price of the units on her Facebook pages as well as the Guild page.
- **E.** Christmas Party venue The group agreed that the Christmas Party would be held at the Moose Lodge again this year. Colleen will make the arrangements.
- **F.** Christmas Party ticket price The group agreed to keep the Christmas Party ticket price the same as last year if the cost to the guild has not changed and to only increase the ticket price as needed if the cost to the guild has increased.

**G.** Ice Cream Social – Colleen has secured the St. Andrews room and paid the security deposit for the Ice Cream Social. Since last year's RSVP didn't result in an accurate count, we will just plan for 90 attendees and not ask for an RSVP from anyone. We will continue to have the free raffle and Colleen asked for donations to be used for prizes.

#### VI. New Business:

- **A. Proposed 2023-2024 Budget** Deanna reviewed the 2023/24 budget handout. The spreadsheet reflected a balanced budget. The revenue was projected low to allow for a minimum of expenditures. It is expected that revenue will increase and thus allow the board to increase line items that may need more funding. A motion to approve the proposed budget was made by Nicki Lura and seconded by Carlene Raczynski. The proposed budget was approved unanimously with the exception of one abstention.
- **B.** Auction The group agreed to hold the auction again this year. Colleen will coordinate it and make suggestions for best selling items. The auction will run the week of Thanksgiving.
