### **Opportunity Quilt**


Hello quilty friends!

Upcoming quilt shows were discussed. May 13 – Fort Jones, June 1-4 – Redding Quilt Bash, June 24 & 25 - Fort Bragg, September 16 & 17 – Sutter, October 7 & 8 – Lakeport. That's just a portion of the list.

### **Board Meeting Minutes**

#### VQG BOARD MEETING

Monday, June 12, 2023 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

- **I. Call to Order:** A Meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was held on June 12, 2023, at the Crossroads Community Church. It was called to order at 4:04 pm.
- II. Announcements and additions to the agenda: VI. (New Business) Bishop's Pumpkin Farm
- **III. Secretary:** A motion to approve the minutes of the May meeting as corrected was made by Eileen Milligan and seconded by Jan A Thompson. A unanimous vote to approve followed.

#### Correspondence - None

**IV. Treasurer:** As of 6/12/23 we have a combined Checking and Savings balance of \$24,458.66. Out of that balance \$5,788.00 is money that has been raised for the new pole and drape system leaving \$18,670.66 available. The Quilt Show balance is \$5,711.98 and the Fair Equity account balance is \$1239.89.

#### V. Old Business:

- **A.** New Officers We have a full possible slate of officers for the coming year that will be presented and voted upon at the June 28, 2023 meeting
- **B.** Fair Judging was completed June 11, 2023. There were about 70 quilts judged (more than double of last year). Set up is Wednesday, June 14, 2023. All slots are currently covered for fair workers. Take down will be at 9 pm on Sunday June 25.
- **C. Poles and Drapes** Valley Quilt Guild received \$945 in donations towards the poles and drapes at the May meeting. That brings the total donations to \$6,733. On June 5<sup>th</sup> Colleen Pelfrey ordered the poles and drapes to complete the setup for our show. The cost was \$6732.58. There will be additional costs for conduit, paracord, paint, and canvas storage bags. Any additional donations that come in will go towards these items. Colleen would like to say a big thank you to all who donated. We are still looking for a home for the old quilt frames.

#### VI. New Business:

**Bishop's Pumpkin Farm** – Bishop's Pumpkin Farm has opened their facility up to 8 quilt guilds on September 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Eight different opportunity quilts will be on display and guilds will be selling tickets. The 8 guilds are also joining together to make a "pumpkin" theme quilt that will be displayed and won by someone attending the event. Our guild is also working on some children's activities for the event.

- **B. Community Service:** Diane reports that all is going well with Community Service.
- **C. Membership**: Nicki Lura reported that we have 171 members and 10 affiliates. The new membership year starts July 1, and we have members starting to renew. Member dues for the next year are \$40, \$44 for affiliates.
- **D. Quilt Show**: Nothing to report this month
- **E. Opportunity Quilt 2024:** The 2024 Opportunity quilt is complete. Tickets have been delivered. Its first outing is to The Oroville Quilt Guild meeting on June 15.
- **F. Other:** A budget meeting for the combined out going and incoming officers is being scheduled to work on a proposed budget to be voted on at the July board meeting.

**Adjournment**: The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 pm.
