Quilt Show Entries

Members...Time to start thinking about Quilt Show entries for this years show "Colors of the Valley". The show will be held on March 9th & 10th, 2024. We will have Rules of Entry and Quilt show Entry forms for both Regular (Non-Judged) and Judged Entries (these forms are printed in Red type). Forms and instructions are available at our table starting with at the October General Meeting. So please stop by and pick up entry forms. We will also be accepting completed entry forms. Mailed entries can be sent to Pat May, PO Box 1166, Yuba City, CA 95992. We will **no longer** have our entry forms available on our website. This did not work well for the 2022 Show and created too much additional paperwork.

IMPORTANT Reminders and Additional F.Y.I:

- · All entries must have a completed Regular Entry form.
- · If your entry is to be Judged, you must have both a Regular Entry Form and a Judged Entry form, plus the \$5.00 entry fee.
- · All entries MUST HAVE a 3" sleeve sewn or pinned to the top on the back of each quilt (<u>NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE.</u>)
- · Accurate Measurements please. Fabric Swatches & a good quality 4"X6" Photos need to be stapled of the top copy of the upper right corner of your **Regular Entry form**.
- · You must be a VQG Member to enter. (Please encourage anyone who wishes to enter to join the Guild).

IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER:

- · Last date to accept entries will be the January 31ST, 2024, at the VQG General Meeting.
- Entry numbers will be handed out on a 4" x 6" card at the VQG February General Meeting held on 2/28/24. Your cloth labels will be attached to your card. A entry # is assigned to your quilt/article, please put this number on your quilt/article label. You will need to save this card, as it is your receipt to pick up your quilt/article after the show.
- · Delivery of Judged Quilt Entries ONLY Quilts are to be delivered to LOCATION AND DATE IS TO BE DETERMINED, and announced at a later date. This information will be printed on your card/receipt.
- · Delivery of your Regular quilt/article These must be delivered to the Y.S. Fairgrounds on Friday, March 8, 2024, starting at 8:00 a.m. and are to arrive no later than 9:30 a.m.
- · Pickup Quilt/article must be picked up on Sunday, March 10, 2024, from 5-5:30 p.m. Bring your card/receipt to claim your item(s).

How can you purchase a ticket?

Nicki Lura will be selling them at the October meeting for \$15. You must have paid your membership dues prior to purchasing a ticket. It is a members only event. If you can't come to the October meeting, maybe ask a friend to purchase your ticket for you. If all else fails, mail Colleen a check made out to Valley Quilt Guild for \$15, and Colleen will put your name down on the list, and have your ticket ready for you at the door. Deadline to mail a check is November 15.

How can you help?

Sign up to donate a door prize (smaller items everyone gets tickets just for coming) — we currently have 5 people signed up

Sign up to donate a Christmas Party Raffle Basket (these are the larger baskets that members purchase raffle tickets for). Often a group of people will get together to create a basket. We currently have 2 sign ups. We could definitely use more.

Sign up to decorate a single or a double table – remember your table will be assigned by drawing a number. We currently have 3 tables being decorated. We have 16 tables to decorate.

We have the opportunity to donate items to people who might need a donation. We'll be collecting toiletries for men and women, Calendars and Christmas Cards and \$15 gift certificates for our Veterans (Walmart, Amazon, and fast food suggested), and socks.

October Fat Chance theme is "Colors of the Harvest". Think Fall prints, golds, brown, orange, red.



Colors of the Valley Challenge

Colors of the Valley is this year's challenge theme. The opportunity quilt was made with a variety of strips, in many colors, in a variety of shades.

When you think about the colors of the valley, what are the images that come to mind? Blooming orchards in the spring, summer fruit stands of strawberries, blueberries and blackberries; the Peach Festival, the green of rice fields, gardens of vegetables, nurseries full of blooming flowers. Don't forget the colors of the Buttes at different times of the year. Inspiration is all around us!

Here are the guidelines:

- Any size, any shape up to a maximum of 36x36;
- Use selvage strips and contrast color(s);
- A minimum of 8 half square triangles made with selvage. You can of course use more than 8 in your design;
- You may use any additional design elements, if you wish;
- Don't forget you need a sleeve.

Your entry can be submitted (in a paper bag) to Sandra Torres by Wednesday, November 22nd. Bring it to the October meeting or connect with Sandra directly to arrange pick up or delivery times.

Rally-Up Auction Fundraiser

A big thank you to members who have already donated items to the auction we will be having in November. If you have items you want to donate, please bring them to the October meeting, and fill out an information card and pin it to your item. Remember, items may start a bidding war or may sell for less than their value, and it is really hard to predict. If it will upset you, it's okay not to donate. If you can let it go, anything helps to raise money. Any items not getting any bids will be returned to their donors.

Block of the Month

For those of you who have finished all 12 blocks, feel free to finish your quilt top as you wish. I intended to send out directions for a simple sashing with cornerstones, and a 2nd possibility of a triple sashing. It's still possible I might, but in the meantime, feel free to do your own thing. Life happened and it hasn't been high enough on the list yet. My apologies. I'm hoping a lot of you will have finished tops (or even finished quilts) to share at the Christmas party.

Also, I will still send blocks to you as you finish the previous block even if you are way behind.

Board Meeting Minutes

VQG BOARD MEETING

Monday, October 9, 2023 4:00-5:30 Crossroads Community Church 445 B Street, Yuba City

Attendees: Sandy Parker, President; Deanna Williams, 1st Vice President; Colleen Pelfrey, Co-2nd Vice President; Bonnie Sloan, Secretary; Marcella Westhouse, Treasurer; Janell Willis, 2024 Quilt Show Chairman; Sharon Easter, NCQC & QGNQ Representative; Diane Leighton, Community Service; Nicki Lura, Membership; Eileen Milligan, BOM.

I. Call to Order: A meeting of the Valley Quilt Guild Board was scheduled for October 9, 2023, at the Crossroads Community Church. The meeting location was not available and therefore moved to Diane Leighton's house. The meeting was called to order at 4:23pm.

II. Announcements and additions to the agenda:

Sandy Parker had requested that under New Business, an item, "New Computer" be added to the agenda. (Inadvertently left off agenda by the secretary.)

III. Secretary: A motion to approve the minutes of the September 2023 meeting as written was made by Colleen Pelfrey and seconded by Eileen Milligan. <u>A unanimous vote to approve the minutes as written followed.</u>

Correspondence: A thank you note was received from Rideout/Adventist Hospital for the guild's donation of 15 fidget quilts.

IV. Treasurer: Marcella was unable to use the guild computer to access bank account balances for this meeting and the bank was closed on this date due to a holiday.

Old Business:

Bank account update - Sandy stated that the bank accounts have all been updated and new checks ordered.

Christmas party – Colleen said we could use more donations for raffle baskets and door prizes. 40 tickets have been sold so far.

Auction – Colleen noted we have 10 items donated for the auction at this time.

Audit – Colleen reported that Cooky (not present) had finished her internal review of the guild books, and will pass it on to Diane Leighton for her internal review.

Bishop's – Deanna noted that the guild made \$89 the first day and \$86 the second day from opportunity quilt raffle ticket sales.

Meeting location – The October guild general meeting will be held at Cal Trans in Marysville.

New Business:

Approval of Quilt Show budget. Presented by Janell and Colleen. The board reviewed the line items of the budget. A motion was made by Diane Leighton to approve the Quilt Show budget as amended and submitted and seconded by Nicki Lura. <u>A unanimous vote to approve the Quilt Show budget as submitted followed.</u>

Board minutes continued...

2025 Quilt Show Chair – Colleen will continue recruiting efforts for the 2025 Quilt Show Chair.

Joining Chamber of Commerce – Janell explained the benefits of joining the Chamber of Commerce. The cost for non-profit organizations is \$200 a year. A motion was made by Colleen Pelfrey to join the Chamber of Commerce and seconded by Diane Leighton. A unanimous vote to join the Chamber of Commerce followed.

Quilts of Valor – Due to the popularity and positive response to the veteran's quilts at the 2023 Quilt Show, Janell asked if we could display and give quilts to veterans again at the 2024 Quilt Show. However, we will refer to the effort as, Quilts for Veterans or Quilts of Honor to avoid confusion with the Quilts of Valor organization. The matter will be further discussed at the 2024 Quilt Show committee meeting.

New Computer – Sandy advised the board that Marcella can't fulfill her duties as treasurer due to the guild's outdated laptop computer. Discussion about the computer and current accounting software ensued. At Colleen's suggestion, Sandy and Marcella will talk with Cookie Amarel about the current laptop and accounting software and any compatibility issues that might arise from using the accounting software on a new computer. The Board approved looking into the purchase of a new computer, up to \$700. Depending on the result of the research, a meeting will need to be called (prior to the next regularly scheduled board meeting) via Zoom, as a vote would need to be held by the Board to approve an expenditure to purchase a new computer laptop.

Committee Reports:

Vice Presidents: September - The Cindy Needham class has been rescheduled to October 28, 2023.

Community Service: Diane will have the next work day on Monday, October 23rd.

Membership: Nikki reported that we now have 141 paid members and 7 affiliates.

Quilt Show: (Reported under New Business items A and D.)

Opportunity Quilt: Deanna reported there are no visits with the opportunity quilt this month.

Other: No other issues.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 5:56 pm.

The next Board Meeting will be held on <u>Monday, November 13, 2023, at 4:00 p.m.</u>, at Crossroads Community Church.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order, via Zoom (video conference call) at 4:05pm.

Old Business:

New Computer: (See New Business Item E above.) Marcella reported that she had meet with Cooky Amarel and her I.T. specialist, who agreed that the computer was no longer functional and that the guild's accounting software, QuickBooks, should be able to transfer onto a new laptop, as well as the dollar amount of potential related expenses.

Discussion regarding the lap top, software and expenses ensued.

A motion was made by Colleen Pellfrey to approve up to \$700 for the purchase of a computer, after Marci meets with Cooky again to make sure we aren't spending money that isn't necessary. Sandy Parker asked for further discussion before the vote.

An amended motion was made by Janell Willis, to approve up to \$700 for the purchase of a new computer now, and up to \$80 for an I.T. install of the software and \$250 a year for I.T. computer support if it becomes necessary, and put the total of \$1,030 in the 2024 budget. The amended motion was seconded by Sandy Parker. A unanimous vote to approve the amended motion as stated followed.
