# Greetings from your Board President:


Hello Fellow VQG Members!

### Quilt Show March 2025 Entries, Judging, Things to Remember

**QUILT SHOW ENTRIES**, Members... "Country Living" Quilt Show Entries!!! We will have Quilt Show Entry forms available the January 29<sup>th</sup> meeting (this is the last date to accept entries). So please stop by and pick up and/or drop off your entry forms. Mailed entries can be sent to Pat May, 1914 Rameriz Dr., Yuba City, CA 95993 and must be received by 1/29/25. We will **no longer** have our form available on our website.

#### **IMPORTANT Reminders and Additional F.Y.I:**

- · All entries must have a completed Regular Entry form.
- · <u>ALL ENTRIES MUST HAVE A 3" SLEEVE SEW OR PINNED AT THE TOP OF THE QUILT BACK</u>. No exceptions will be made!! Our new frame system requires sleeves on all articles to be hung.
- · If your entry is to be Judged, it must have both a Regular Entry Form & a Judged Entry form, plus the \$5.00 entry fee.
- · Accurate Measurements please. Fabric Swatches & a good quality 4" X 6" Photos need to be stapled of the top copy of the upper right corner of your Regular Entry form.
- · You must be a VQG Member to enter. (Please encourage anyone who wishes to enter to join the Guild).

#### **IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER:**

- · Last date to accept entries will be the January 29, 2025, at the VQG General Meeting.
- · Entry numbers will be handed out on a 4" x 6" card at the VQG February General Meeting held on 2/26/25, your cloth labels will be attached to your card/receipt. A entry # is assigned to your quilt/article, please put this number on your quilt/article label. This will be sewn to the back of your quilt in the lower left hand corner. You will need to save this card, as it is your receipt to pick up your quilt/article after the show.
- **Delivery of Judged Quilt Entries ONLY** Quilts are to be delivered Thursday, March 6<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 8:30 a.m to 9:00 a.m. Rideout Conference Center, 969 Plumas St., YC this information will also be printed on your card/receipt.
- **Delivery of your Regular quilt/article** These must be delivered to the Y.S. Fairgrounds on Friday, March 7, 2025, starting at 8:00 a.m. and are to arrive no later than 9:30 a.m.
- · Pickup Quilt/article must be picked up on Sunday, March 9, 2025 from 5-5:30 p.m. Bring your card/receipt to claim your item(s). We are looking forward to another wonderful show this next year!!! Give us a call if you have any questions!

### Quilt Show March 2025 Sign Ups, Set Up, I Want to Help!!

Believe it or not, the quilt show is right around the corner, and I hope you will be part of the army of volunteers it takes to put on the show. Sign up sheets for jobs we need help with will be out at both the January and February meetings. I have listed some of the signup sheets below that will give you an idea what you can expect the duties to be. Consider what you are able to help with and please sign up in more than one place. There may be additional signup sheets depending on whether a chairperson is filling their own shifts or setting out signup sheets.

Things we always need a lot of help with:

Thursday: Ironing windsocks – starts at 8 am.

Thursday: Pre-set up. People are needed to transport poles, drapes, and supplies from storage to

the fairgrounds. Pickups and SUVs are best. Voluntelling able spouses is allowed.

I also need a small team (4 able bodied people) to help with presetting up stands and uprights. Let me know if you are interested.

Friday: Set up. Finish hanging the drapes. Starts at 9

Distributing rods to the correct frames

Placing quilts by the correct frames and hanging quilts—Starts around 10

Pinning information cards to quilts

Gathering pillowcases after quilts are removed, folding, and putting numerically back in

the boxes

Table Set Up Vendors and Kitchen Area - Starts at 9 am

**Stapling Programs** 

Saturday

& Sunday: Sign up for a shift

**White Glove Person** (Showing viewers the backs of quilts, answering questions, encouraging people not to touch the quilts. Sign up for a shift

**Community Service Area** (Actively work on community service quilts, answer questions about community service

#### **Sunday Take Down**

Taking quilts to designated tables and folding label side out

Running folded quilts to kitchen area

Taking down drapes. Folding and putting in correct boxes.

Taking down rods, crossbars, uprights, and bases and putting the right size and number in each labeled bag.

Loading stuff for storage into vehicles

Driving to storage and putting away

Staying until the last dog dies making sure everything is clean, swept and put away.
