Greetings from your Board President:


Hello Fellow VQG Members!

Let's go stripping with lots of colors! Shenanigans uses two flows of colors to make this great looking version of an Irish chain. Fussy cut squares provide for a more dramatic effect. The class focuses on accurate cutting, sewing, and pressing to nest seams for a smoother finished quilt. We will also discuss getting the most out of your fabric when fussy cutting. Four size options are available. This is a great one day class for all skill levels. The Irish chains in this pattern use 3 colors. Perfect for Three Part Harmony theme for next year's quilt show!!



Quilt Show 2026 Three Part Harmony

As our Country Living show wraps up at the March meeting, I am excited to share news about the 2026 **Three Part Harmony** show. Three Part Harmony for me is about music and the blending of instruments and voices that come together to create a harmony that is beautiful to the ears.
